**Subject: Study of the impact of Comenius Centralised Actions: Comenius Multilateral Projects and Comenius Multilateral Networks - EAC/17/2010**

Dear Madam, Dear Sir,

Since 2000 the Comenius centralised actions have been supporting European co-operation and networking of institutions and organisations involved in school education working together to improve the quality of teaching and learning in the classroom.

To assess the achievement of their aim to improve the initial or in-service training of school educational staff and to promote educational good practice and innovation, the European Commission has asked Ellinogermaniki Agogi based in Pallini Attikis in Greece, to carry out a study of the impact of the Comenius centralised actions, Comenius Multilateral Projects and Comenius Multilateral Networks, on the institutions, organisations and individuals participating in and/or benefitting from them.

The objectives of the study is to analyse in which way Comenius centralised actions influence teaching, learning, teacher training, classroom management and education policies. The study will be based on online survey, interviews and case studies. It will provide insights into the typical structure of consortia and help us assess how cooperation at European level has contributed to the implementation of projects and to the achievement of projects' objectives.

The recommendations on possible improvements to the actions based on the study findings will be used to improve the way the action will be managed under the future European education programme.
